POLAR OPERATIONS



AVTEC Maritime's Polar Operations course meets the training and standards of competence required by STCW Code Section A-V/4 and Table A-V/4-1, as amended 2010, for STCW Endorsements for Basic Polar Code Operations.

During this five-day course, mariners will study ice science, global policy differences and ice impacts to maritime operations. Students will explore the dynamic relationship between navigation and environmental concerns in remote regions. While emphasizing Alaskan and Arctic waters, students will delve into the Polar Code - preparing them for world-wide professional applications. These skills are applied while operating AVTEC's state-of-the-art maritime simulator and navigating across different ice conditions and replications of ice-related incidents.
