



Stage 0: School Closure due to localized outbreak

Stage 1: Restricted Operations essential activities only.

This stage may apply to specific housing areas, training programs, or the entire school.

Access for visitors to campus facilities is restricted to essential only with prior permission from administration or building manager. • SERVICES: All services unavailable in person: remote appointments available • INSTRUCTIONAL: Only training that can be conducted remotely • ON-CAMPUS HOUSING: Congregate housing is open at 50% maximum capacity. Residents encouraged to return home to remain until metrics change. All lounges closed and recreation activities cancelled. • MEAL SERVICES: Cafeteria services are 'To Go' only • WORKPLACE: Staff will telework on a case by case basis • STUDENT TRANSPORTATION: For Emergencies only with PPE and maximum distancing. Stage 2: Minimal Operations with resumption of basic training and essential operations only

Access for visitors to campus facilities is restricted SERVICES: Open testing lab/room by appointment only. Single entrance access. Remote appointments are strongly encouraged. All appointments must be scheduled INSTRUCTIONAL: Remote instruction continues as necessary. In-person training only when protective measures can be implemented. Restricted class sizes (50% or fewer students based on pre-March 2020 capacity) ON-CAMPUS HOUSING: Congregate housing is open at 50% maximum capacity. All lounges closed and recreation activities cancelled MEAL SERVICES: Cafeteria services are 'To Go' only WORKPLACE: Staff will telework on a case by case basis. Stage 3: Moderated Operations with resumption of some operations and close monitoring

Exceptions made for doors closest to active services/training. Access for visitors to campus facilities is by appointment only: SERVICES: Open testing lab/room by appointment only. Single entrance access. Remote appointments are strongly encouraged. INSTRUCTIONAL: Remote instruction continues as necessary. In-person training only when protective measures can be implemented. Restricted class sizes (50% or fewer students based on pre-March 2020 capacity) ON-CAMPUS HOUSING: Congregate housing is open at 50% maximum capacity. All lounges closed and group recreation activities cancelled MEAL SERVICES: Cafeteria services are organized in small groups by program (25 max per seating) 'To Go' meals are available for all residents. WORKPLACE: Staff will telework on a case by case basis. Residents are strongly encouraged to minimize time in public spaces or with groups other than their training cohort Students who travel outside of Seward may not return to campus until receiving a negative test result Signage to encourage personal hygiene (handwashing, coughing into sleeve) Sanitization of common/shared areas and facilities at least 3x per day Operations/protective measures will be re-evaluated by Administration, Student Services, Residence Life, and Environmental Services at least every 72 hours



Stage 4: Traditional Operations with legacy policies and procedures
